Student Free Day Week 6 Friday 18th Nov:

As advertised in our Term Planner, we will be having a Student Free Day on Friday 18th November. The purpose is for ongoing Staff Professional Development.

School Uniform:

As highlighted in our last newsletter, we are 'raising the bar' this term with higher expectations across the board. The School uniform is one area we will be focusing on. As we head towards the end of the year, please ensure that your children still maintain a high level of presentation and have all correct uniform requirements. This includes hair, hats, jewellery and shoes. If any clothing items are damaged or misplaced, please send a note in with your child explaining why they have incorrect uniform and try to rectify the problem as soon as possible.

School Buses:

Many of our children travel on the Government Bus System to and from school. At times throughout the year I have met with the children and talked about the importance of their behaviour on the bus so that everyone travelling feels safe. Many children understand this and we have very few problems. However, there seems to be a number of children at the moment not abiding by the Rules of Conduct for bus travelling and I ask your support in reinforcing the message that good behaviour on the bus is necessary for their safety and that of others. If you have any concerns please let me know. A reminder that all applications for bus travel during 2014 should have been returned to Lyn at our front office. Please attend to this if you haven't done so already.

<u>Child Safety—Drop Off & Pick Up Times:</u> REMINDER: We again thank parents/carers who are following the start and end of the day procedures when dropping off or picking up their children. However, we have received reports that people have been reckless and inconsiderate of safety at times. We are aware that we cannot control what happens outside the school grounds but by using friendly reminders we may highlight child safety as a priority. We wish to outline the following points:-

- Cars should not stop at intersections or crossings to collect children.
- Please use the 'flagged' road crossings appropriately.
- Remember the speed limit when approaching



Remembrance Day Monday 11th November:

It is with great honour and respect that I promote Remembrance Day. It marks the anniversary of the armistice which ended the First World War (1914-1918). Each year Australians observe one minute silence at 11am on 11th of November, in memory of those who died or suffered in all wars and armed conflicts. We will have a presence at our local service on Monday 11/11/2013. We will also be having our own service starting at 10.50am on Monday. All families and friends are welcome to attend under the shelter. this crossing—25km/hr (this should apply all around the school).

- Parents and caregivers are encouraged to park their vehicle and come to the collection point, inside the front gate, to collect their child/children.
- Cars should not be parked as to obstruct residential driveways or laneways.
- Alternative arrangements are welcomed students walking home, arrive 5 min later etc.
- A phone call is appreciated if you are running late for collection at 3.15pm.



Konnective is a mobile app that allows us to communicate with you, our parents, straight to your smartphone. We will be sending news, events, photos and more so that you can be even more connected with your children's activities and events at the school. Using the Konnective app, you can add events directly to your phone's calendar, set reminders for things you need to do and receive important alerts (similar to a text message) as soon as they are released.
