St Mary of the Cross MacKillop Feast Day - "Never see a need without doing something about it"

On Thursday, we will celebrate the feast day of St Mary MacKillop, who together with Fr Julian Tenison Woods, began the Sisters of St Joseph, an order of religious Sisters. Their vision was to provide a Catholic Education for children of the poor and disadvantaged, with a mission to help those in need and they dedicated their life to helping the poor, the homeless, the lonely and the sick.

By learning about St Mary MacKillop (the Australian people's saint), we promote numerous fine and desirable qualities and characteristics, such as being strong willed, determined, honest, generous, caring, courageous, and people of integrity. Along with some of her main messages including 'find happiness in making others happy' and her famous 'never see a need without doing something about it', we hope this will help guide our children to be better people in our community.

Higher Expectations this Semester- PBIS & A Choice/B Choice:

We are consolidating our PBIS structures, expectations and routines and are using a common and consistent language to help students take responsibility for their own actions, attitudes and choices. We continue to use the 5 Point Scale to help students regulate their feelings and emotions and we are using A Choice and B Choice processes to encourage appropriate behaviours and attitudes.

I encourage parents to have that usual talk with their child about appropriate behaviours and attitudes and discuss goal setting and expectations, so each day of learning can be maximised to build opportunity and success.























Religious Identity & Mission:

On Thursday, we will celebrate Mary MacKillop's Feast Day to commemorate Mary's journey of faith, her life and her legacy. St Mary of the Cross MacKillop is the Patron Saint of our Port Pirie Diocese. She opened the first Catholic school in South Australia in Penola, educating the children who were considered poor and not able to gain an education. Mary rejoiced in her God, loved the poor deeply and believed God would provide. She was a Spirit-filled person who was faithful to her God even when times were tough. Mary saw herself as God's humble servant and was always ready to do God's will.


<u>Other events:</u> Also this term the P&F Committee will be holding a Student Disco (more details to

Student Wellbeing:

Wellbeing and Learning Centre

This term we are trying something new to support wellbeing and learning in our school. We have converted Room 2 into a new Wellbeing and Learning Centre. The Centre has three zones, a Learning Zone, Motor Zone and Calming Zone. Mrs McLeod and Ms Lawton are based in this space along with Charlie!

The Learning Zone is a place where children can work 1:1 or in small groups with Mrs McLeod on tasks set by the classroom teacher. The Motor Zone can be used to develop gross and fine motor skills, as well as heavy work to assist in regulation. These activities create resistance input to the muscles and this feedback helps to calm and regulate the child's nervous system. When children are engaging in heavy work activities their bodies release both serotonin and dopamine which are calming and organising neurotransmitters. Lastly, the Calming Zone provides a peaceful space for children to calm and reset their emotional battery. This space can be used independently or when required, an ESO, Mrs McLeod or Ms Lawton can provide coregulation. The intent of this Centre is to provide alternate learning and regulation space to meet the diverse needs of all learners.

We have already had lots of visitors to the centre, and we have enjoyed seeing them utilise our new space. We look forward to seeing the positive impact the Centre will have on our school community.
