Class Masses:

I have been so pleased with the opportunity to have our Class Masses. They are such an important celebration in our school which outlines our culture and traditions and provides meaningful learning opportunities for our children including practicing public speaking and active participation. We use the messages and themes to teach important attitudes and values of respect, empathy and kindness. We also enjoy the community focus and value the opportunity to join with parishioners and families and share a beautiful morning tea. Today the Year 3 classes did a wonderful job with their Mass and I congratulate Mrs Hayes, Mrs Smith and Miss Haynes, the students and their families.

2025 Staffing and Class Structure:

I continue working through our staffing for 2025 and I hope to have this finalised by the end of this term. At our recent Board meeting, I presented possible models for class structures for 2025. I am pleased to announce that we will maintain 12 classes. When considering such things, there is consultation with staff before the models are finalised. When looking at classes for next year we also consider learning needs of the students, social/emotional/behavioural needs, family/sibling/friend combinations and the available resources of the school. Given the steady increase of enrolments over the past few years, class size is also a very important consideration, along with ESO support. I will announce the final structures for 2025 at the end of this term.

Class Lists for 2025:

Parents who wish to request consideration for their child's placement in classes for 2025 are to submit their requests in writing to me outlining sound educational reasoning for the request. All requests are due by the end of this term.

National Child Protection Week:

Last week, we promoted National Child Protection Week, which aims to engage and educate all Australians to understand they have a part to play in keeping our children and young people safe from violence, abuse and neglect.

At St Joseph's, we support and promote community-led prevention. Our priority is the safety and wellbeing of our students and we believe that by working together with the wider community we will help protect children and young people. Our lessons were well received by the students and we hope they have helped them with strategies in their own lives.

Sports Day:

We are looking forward to our upcoming Sports Day on Wednesday 25th September at St Francis of Assisi College. Mr Smart and Mrs Thompson have been busy preparing the students and have included some new games and different structures. I strongly advocate and promote our Sports Day and remind all students and parents/ carers that it is an expectation that all students participate. As with any normal school day, Sports Day has so many positive learning outcomes. It not only promotes the benefits of exercise but also teaches many life skills, such as how to win and lose, resilience and effort, and also looks at all aspects of sportsmanship. Year 6 students have been practising leading the Health Hustle and House Captains have showed excellent leadership skills with their respective teams.

This learning experience is integrated with their studies in Religious Education and Social & Emotional Learning and is an opportunity for them to develop important skills in, and dispositions towards social justice. A team from both the Adelaide and Riverland St Vincent dePaul Society will be in attendance.

Our Year 6 students continue to take turns in volunteering at the Vinnies shed each Monday morning.
